Position Overview:

Acting Studio Summer Teaching Interns are ambassadors of Taproot Theatre Company's Acting Studio, a program run by the Education and Outreach Department (E&O). Inside the classroom, they are responsible for supporting the growth and training of artists in Pre-K – 12th grade. While on-site they represent E&O to its students and their guardians/families. Summer Teaching interns assist E&O and its Teaching Artists with the production and organization of its Summer Acting Studio programming. During the summer, the Acting Studio operates camps Monday – Friday, roughly 30 hours a week, June – August. It is expected that applicants are available the majority of that time and are committed to the management and betterment of students of all ages. The Acting Studio's mission is to provide a nurturing environment for artists of all ages and experience levels. We teach theatre to develop creativity and storytelling, as well as show them the power of empathy and teamwork and how to be a positive force in this ever-changing world.

Specific Areas of Responsibility

Teaching and Internship

- Attend E&O General and Job specific Summer Internship Training
- Organize and maintain a professional appearance while representing E&O to its patrons
- Nurture and support the growth of young actors
- Coordinate with E&O regarding student health and attendance
- Develop interpersonal skills with a variety of age groups and backgrounds
- Lead and teach games that empower empathy and storytelling
- Lead and teach musical theatre techniques and warm-ups
- Lead physical and vocal warm-ups that empower theatre artists to better understand and maintain their instrument
- Manage activities related to teaching, rehearsal, and technique dependent on Teaching Artist's request
- Display and nurture a growth mindset when interacting with students, Teaching Artists, members of the Production team, E&O, and other staff members

Production Assistance

- Assist in the creation and execution of student plays and musicals and theatrical materials
- Manage students offstage during Acting Studio productions
- Assist students with the upkeep of costumes, props, and set pieces
- Assist in scene changes, entrances, exits, and limited technical effects
- Prepare and perform as an impromptu understudy in situations where students are no longer available, both during rehearsals and performances if necessary
- Communicate with the Directing and Production teams regarding concerns about the health and safety of actors related to props, lighting, sound, and costumes
- When necessary, train students and fellow interns in Taproot's specific offstage etiquette
- Participate in the development of creating theatre professionals who are proficient in theatre etiquette
- Visit performances of other Acting Studio classes to maintain a spirit of camaraderie and growth within E&O

Student Supervision / Growth

- Supervise the safety of all students participating in Acting Studio whether on or off-site
- Help anticipate specific needs related to student participation and engagement
- Facilitate student arrival and departure including check-in, document verification, and check-out to preapproved guardians and family members
- Maintain a high degree of discretion regarding student disabilities, special concerns, allergies, other confidential topics, etc.
- Communicate areas of concern to E&O regarding student safety and engagement
- Assist Teaching Artists with the engagement and management of students inside the classroom and during check-in and check-out
- Cultivate appropriate interpersonal relationships with students and their quardians
- Mentor and nurture positive engagement with core theatre principals and techniques
- Attend Early Check-in and Late Check-out shifts when scheduled to do so
- Inform Teaching Artists of areas of concern regarding bullying situations, inappropriate student behavior, neglect, and all other areas of abuse or concern
- Establish appropriate physical, personal, and emotional boundaries with students, staff, and fellow interns

Required Qualifications/Skills:

- Compatibility with Taproot Theatre Acting Studio's mission and values
- Possess a love of theatre arts that translates to a desire to support the growth of both students and fellow artists through education
- Solid organizational and interpersonal communication skills
- Ability to work both independently and collaboratively on multiple projects, camps, and classes
- Availability to work occasional weekends when required for performance and/or rehearsals
- Background check will be conducted
- COVID-19 vaccination required

Desired Qualifications/Skills:

- Prior experience and comfortability with Pre-K 12 students from a variety of social, cultural, and economic backgrounds
- Prior experience with casting and/or creating auditioning is a plus
- Prior music or choreography training, including ability to read music and lead vocal warm-ups
- Prior theatre experience acting, directing, or assisting with technical elements a plus
- Comfortability with theatre and education jargon
- Willingness to participate in team-building activities and training to improve both personal and professional skills
- Strong communication skills
- Prompt and appropriate responses to time-sensitive correspondence

Pay & Benefits:

- This position pays a weekly amount of \$500. Payment is made each Friday
- Participation in the development and performance of the Summer Intern Showcase
- Program verification for college credit, if applicable
- Theatre Artist panels and department seminars throughout the summer

Seasonal workers, interns, and guest artists represent a diversity of faith traditions and backgrounds. Taproot Theatre welcomes folks of other faith traditions who are comfortable working in a Christian environment to apply for all open positions and does not discriminate on the basis of religion.

Physical Requirements: This position requires frequent sitting or standing, manual dexterity to operate phones, computers, and other office equipment; strong command of the English language with the ability to be understood. The majority of work is required to be done at Taproot classrooms with occasional visits to external environments. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions of the position.

Public Health: Taproot Theatre Company requires every employee, volunteer, and contractor to present proof of vaccination against COVID-19. Proof of vaccination can be a vaccine card (copy or photo accepted), WA state immunization printout, or verified medical record printout from a medical provider.
