Taproot Theatre brings Dean Batali's Lewis and Tolkien to the Isaac Studio Theatre, 15 years after reopening in the wake of arson

Explore the friendship and rivalry between the creators of two of the greatest fantasy worlds, January 22 – February 22, 2025

SEATTLE, WA – December 11, 2024 – Taproot Theatre is excited to present *Lewis and Tolkien,* an intimate and thought-provoking play by Dean Batali, in its cozy, 116-seat Isaac Studio Theatre this winter. Directed by Producing Artistic Director Karen Lund, this production invites audiences to step into the minds of two of the greatest writers of the 20th century—C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien—as they look back at their friendship and delve into their personal and professional rivalries. *Lewis and Tolkien* opens on January 24 and runs through February 22, 2025.

In the cozy Eagle and Child Pub, renowned authors C.S. Lewis and J.R.R. Tolkien joust over pints and memories. Years after the Inklings, they have grown distant, diverging in matters of theology, marriage, and literature. In this fictional encounter, they delve into their personal and professional rivalries, igniting the stage with their wit and wisdom.

Karen Lund directs Peter Cook, Chloe Michele, and Jeff Allen Pierce. Ays Garcia, James Lyle, and Michael Ramquist understudy.

This timing of this production coincides with a replacement of seats in the Jewell Mainstage Theatre, offering an intimate setting to match the richness and depth of Batali's work. Batali, known for his work as a writer on *Buffy the Vampire Slayer* and *That '70s Show*, has longstanding ties to Taproot Theatre, where he worked as an actor and playwright before going to Los Angeles. Audiences will experience the wit and intellect of this talented writer and come away with a deeper look and appreciation for the creators of some of the greatest fantasy works of the past century, which continue to influence fantasy writers to this day.

The production of *Lewis and Tolkien* also coincides with the 15th anniversary of Taproot reopening after an October 2009 arson on its property, which destroyed the restaurants and café that operated in the space and left the theatre gutted. In January 2010, the theatre was

restored and opened its season with an adaptation of C.S. Lewis's *The Great Divorce*, a timely coincidence given the depiction of Lewis in *Lewis and Tolkien*.
