SEATTLE – July 12, 2010 – Learn how to audition like a pro in *Audition!*, a brand-new summer camp from Taproot Theatre's Acting Studio. Taking place August 23-27, this camp will prepare aspiring actors from 5<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade for one of the toughest parts of acting: the audition.
