Newlyweds Lord Peter Wimsey and Harriet Vane discover a body in the basement of their country honeymoon hideaway – murder or accident? Alibi or lie? While the supporting cast of characters complicate this confusing case, Peter and Harriet must decide if the pursuit of truth outweighs the pursuit of happiness.

**Scott Nolte**, TTC's Producing Artistic Director, will direct these beloved literary characters. He most recently directed the world premieres of *Evidence of Things Unseen*, *Dracula* and *This Christmas*. His other recent work at TTC includes *The Trial of Ebenezer Scrooge*, *Joyful Noise* and *Best of Enemies*.
