SEATTLE, WA – June 21, 2019 – Five words were meant to change a young country divided by civil war when abolitionist and Union recruiter Frederick Douglass challenged his president to act on the statement that "all men are created equal." As these two brilliant Americans wage a battle for the future of the Union, their arguments affect not only their sons but the nation we live in today. Originally commissioned for Washington, DC's Ford's Theatre, Taproot Theatre produces the West Coast Premiere of Richard Hellesen's drama.

"Audiences will be stunned to learn of the heartaches, considerations and challenges surrounding some of the decisions Lincoln made," said director **Karen Lund**. "But Frederick Douglass is the real gift. His vision, sacrifices and ideas resulted in an honest and heartfelt debate that left both men different."

The cast includes **Lamar Legend** (Strawberry Theatre Workshop's *Take Me Out*) as Frederick Douglass, **Andrew Litzky** (Taproot Theatre's *The Explorers Club*) as George Stearns and **Ted Rooney** (*Gilmore Girls*, *Boardwalk Empire*) as Abraham Lincoln.

The production team includes **Pete Rush**, costume design; **Brian Engel**, lighting design; **Mark Lund**, scenic and sound design and **Mario Gomez**, dramaturg.
