Taproot Theatre celebrates its birthday with announcement of *Smoke on the Mountain* revival

This bluegrass gospel musical comedy returns after 20 years for Taproot's 50th Anniversary Season

SEATTLE, WA — March 9, 2026 — Taproot Theatre presents a revival of musical comedy *Smoke on the Mountain*. Featuring two dozen bluegrass gospel songs and beloved returning artists, this humorous and heartfelt audience favorite runs **October 7–24, 2026**, in Taproot's intimate **Isaac Studio Theatre** (212 N 85th St, Seattle, WA 98103).

A special surprise for its patrons and long-time supporters on its birthday (March 9, 1976), Taproot announces the addition of *Smoke on the Mountain* as part of its 50th Anniversary Season. Returning after 20 years, this audience favorite is no stranger to Taproot's repertoire. *Smoke on the Mountain* was first produced at Taproot in 1992, and again shortly after in 1996, marking Taproot's first season in its Greenwood facility. The company also produced *Sanders Family Christmas*, a holiday sequel, in 1999 and 2000, as well as *Smoke on the Mountain* in 2006 and *Smoke on the Mountain Homecoming* in 2009.

Smoke on the Mountain features many familiar faces from Taproot's history. Producing Artistic Director Emeritus and Taproot co-founder **Scott Nolte** returns to direct after directing all six previous renditions. After playing twins Dennis & Denise Sanders in Taproot's 1996 production and in both *Sanders Family Christmas* productions, **Sam & Candace Vance** return as Burl & Vera Sanders. Similarly to the Sanders Family, this husband-and-wife duo regularly tour with their family band, A Total Fiasco, across the Puget Sound and beyond.

Synopsis: It's the summer of 1938 in Appalachia, and the Sanders Family Singers have come to a Mount Pleasant Baptist Church, complete with banjos, mandolins, accordions, and all. After five years away from the gospel circuit, they're back—and each member has a story to tell. Between bluegrass harmonies and heart-warming hymns, their stories hilariously and surprisingly spill out. This long-awaited toe-tappin' and hand clappin' production returns to Taproot for its 50th Anniversary with beloved artists and unforgettable comedy.
